Rationale	The indicator is intended to improve the employment outcomes for adults with learning disabilities – a key group at risk of social exclusion.		
Definition	<p>Adults with learning disabilities: All adults aged 18-69 with learning disabilities that are known to ‘Councils with Adult Social Services Responsibilities’ (CASSRs)</p> <p>Employed:</p> <p>1 – working full-time as an employee or self-employed (16 or more hours per week);</p> <p>2 – working as an employee or self-employed (5 to 15 hours per week);</p> <p>3 – working as an employee or self-employed (1 to 4 hours per week).</p> <p>Categories 1-3 above are to be combined to report on the employment rate for this group.</p>		
Formula	$\left(\frac{x}{y} \right) * 100$ <p>Where: x = the number of adults with learning disabilities known to CASSRs in employment y = the total number of adults with learning disabilities known to CASSRs</p>		
Worked example	Adults with LD = 87,486 Adults with LD in Emp. = 17,147 Proportion = $(17,147/87,486) \times 100 = 19.6\%$ (hypothetical data)	Good performance	Good performance is typified by a positive increase in percentage
Collection interval	Annual	Data Source	Key Statistics 1 (collected by the Information Centre).
Return Format	Percentage	Decimal Places	One
Reporting organisation	Local authorities provide data to the Information Centre for Health and Social Care		
Spatial level	Single tier and county council
